Extra Troops Called to End Bombay Riots

Fifteen New Deaths Reported in Hindu-Moslem Stabbing Affrays

Bombay, India, May 20-(Associated Press)-Governor Sykes today called out the Fifth Bombay Field Brigade, the Royal Artillery Auxiliary Force and the Bombay Light Horse, made up of non-official Europeans, to supplement the regular forces in dealing with the Hindu-Moslem riots.

Although there was less rloting today and a measurable return o confidence, the governor thought it necessary to call out the additional units as a precautionary measure. Fifteen deaths were added to the total of more than 100 killed thus far in the rioting. Most of day's casualties were

The Hindus attempted to burn a Muslem mosque in the mill area early in the day, but police prevented it and arrested 40 Hindus.






